

Top Tips for TEMPOart's "Dancing for Joy" Photo Contest

Photographing public art is an exciting way to tell a story about how art interacts with the world around it. A sculpture like *Dancing for Joy* isn't just about its physical form—it's about its relationship with light, space, and the people who experience it. When approaching this contest, think like a storyteller. What emotions or ideas does this piece evoke in you? How do you see others connecting with it? Let those questions guide your process.

This contest is a chance for you to combine technical skills with creativity. Approach it with curiosity and a sense of wonder, and let the sculpture inspire you to see the world in new ways. Your unique perspective matters, and we can't wait to see how you capture the spirit of *Dancing for Joy*!

1. Pick the Perfect Time

Start by observing the sculpture at different times of day. Morning and evening light, often called the "golden hours," can create soft, warm tones that bring out the bamboo's textures. Midday light, while harsher, might highlight bold shadows or vibrant details. Think about the weather, too—a cloudy sky can make the colors and shapes of the piece stand out, while a sunny day can add brightness and energy.

- **Sunrise/Sunset:** Warm, golden light = magic vibes.
- Cloudy Days: Soft light helps details pop.
- Sunny Days: Bright and cheerful!

2. Get Creative with Angles

When you're framing your shot, remember to experiment. Try standing close, far away, or even crouching low for a cool perspective. Take a few photos up close to emphasize details like the patterns or curves in the sculpture, then step back to show its connection to the surrounding environment. If people are nearby, consider capturing how they interact with the art. Someone sitting peacefully beneath it or walking by with curiosity can add a sense of scale and emotion to your photo.

3. Use What You Have

Remember, you don't need fancy equipment to tell a compelling story. A smartphone camera can be just as powerful as a professional one if you focus on the composition, lighting, and message of your image. Before you click, ask yourself: What do I want someone to feel when they see this photo? When your image reflects your unique perspective, it becomes a powerful story in itself.

4. Follow the Rules

Double-check <u>TEMPOart's guidelines</u> for sending your photos. Write a little note about why your shot is awesome!

5. Be Kind to the Art

Stay off the sculpture—it's there to admire, not climb. Let others enjoy the space, too.
